

IASBABA'S GEOGRAPHY OPTIONAL TEST SERIES 2021 - SCHEDULE

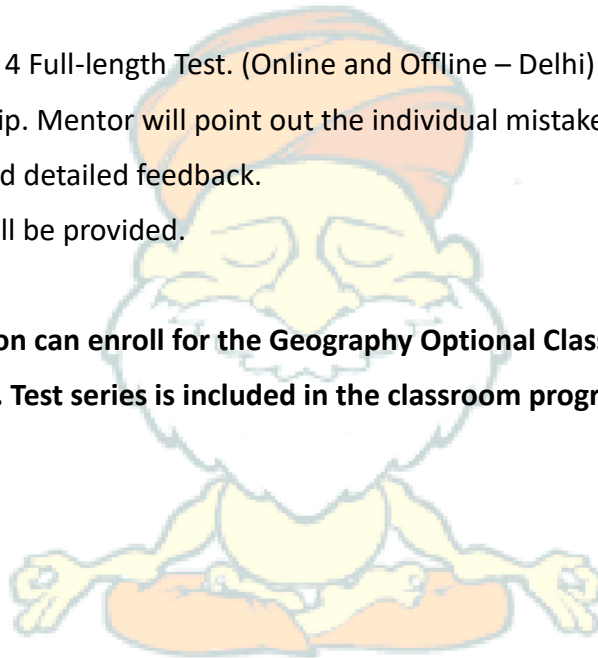
Hello Everyone,
